16.	In the middle of a transformation, there is a dot called a, which indicates the

20.	If your computer won't let you do certain things (like switch layers, etc.) look for:

21.	Scale, rotate, skew, perspective and distort are examples of
22.	This selection tool is ideal for solid background selection:

23.	When using the tool, you can adjust the tolerance to identify how "picky" it will be when
	selecting. A higher number means it is less picky and a low number means it is super picky.
24.	When using selection tools, it's a really good idea to closely.
25.	You can brush over a selection using the tool to add areas into a selection until you get
	everything you want.
26.	To change the quick selection brush size, use the options bar or press to decrease brush size and to
	increase the size.
27.	Holding Shift when selecting with the wand or other selection tools will what you click next to the
	selection; holding will from the selection. You can also use the buttons on the
	Options bar.
28.	Hold while resizing a selection to maintain proportions; you don't want to oryour
	selections and end up with Oompa Loompas!
29.	After making a selection, you can fill it using or by pressing Shift + to
	bring up the dialog box quickly. Pressing just will fill it with the current background color.
30.	After making a selection, you can add a border (called a) around it by pressing Edit>
31.	Press+ click on the layer thumbnail preview to select (put the marching ants) around the item on the
	layer.
32.	The lasso is a "click, let go, and drag" lasso that tries to predict where the borders of a selection
	should be.
33.	To back up if one of your lasso points lands in the wrong spot, just press and pull the mouse back
	and then continue the process.
34.	Thelasso is like a dot-to-dot lasso; click to create points and Photoshop draws lines between them to
	create your selection.
35.	to end a lasso selection if you cannot find your exact starting point.
36.	The regular lasso allows you to make a selection
37.	You can magically copy/paste a selected item by switching to the Move tool and holding while dragging. If
	not a layered item, it does not put each duplicate on a new
38.	To move an item that is on the layer of another item, you must it first.
39.	You can move a selection using your mouse or
40.	To use the alignment or distribute buttons on the Options bar for the Move tool, you must first select all layers that
	are involved by+ clicking each layer.
